Saturday, 14 May – Official prize giving and dinner. All teams to arrive & be seated prior to 7pm. To be held in NZCT Stadium at Te Rauparaha Arena.

Times

- Warm Up - Minimum of 10 minutes
- Playing Time - 4 x 10 minute stop clock quarters
- Half Time – 10 minutes
- Quarter Time Intervals – 2 minutes
- Extra Periods – 5 minutes
- Extra Period Intervals – 2 minutes

WBC Meeting

Traditionally there has been a meeting for all team management and association representatives to discuss the current and next year's season. However, this year the format of feedback will be an online survey. BBNZ hopes this new format will gain a wider view from a larger number of people. The survey won't be the only source to gather information; BBNZ will speak with Tall Ferns management, some Associations and their team management and players.

The survey link will be sent to all Associations to provide feedback and comment on the 2016 & 2017 WBC seasons. To ensure that BBNZ is able to distribute a summary of the survey to all Associations within a timely manner, we ask that the survey is completed within the timeframe advised.

We encourage Associations to forward the survey onto your WBC team management and players to complete. The link will be sent after the Porirua Tournament.

WBC Dinner and Award

The dinner will be located at Te Rauparaha Arena across the corridor from court 2 and 3, in the small stadium called the NZCT Stadium. Teams who have requested extra tickets must make payment prior to Saturday and must liaise with Emily Cox. If you require an invoice please advise.

The dinner will open at 6:30pm and start promptly at 7pm. Please ensure all are seated prior to 7pm.

Points System

1. 2 points for win, 1 point for a loss and default, 0 for a forfeit.
2. If teams are drawn on points after round robin play, then it will go back to the game where they played each other to decide the final placing or goal difference if more than two teams with the same points total. Please refer to the FIBA Official Basketball Rules, 'Classification of Teams'.

Competition Structure

Every team will play each team once in a round robin format over Tournament 1 and 2.

At the end of Tournament 2, teams are split where the top 6 teams will go to the Championship Section, two pools of 3 teams and the bottom 5 teams go into the Plate Section, one pool of 5 teams for Tournament 3.

Tournament 3 will see a straight round robin in both the Championship and Plate Sections. The two top teams in the Championship Section after the round robin, will play a cross over semi final and a final for 1st to 4th place.

The third placed teams in the Championship section after the round robin will play each other (Plate semi).

1st Plate Section plays the winner of the plate semi final playing off for 5th and 6th. The loser of the plate semi final will play the 2nd in the Plate section for 7th and 8th place. 3rd in the Plate section will play 4th Plate section for 9th and 10th place.

Disputes Procedure

In the unlikely event of a dispute the procedure is: the team captain is to sign the bottom of the score sheet in the box provided within 20 minutes of the completion of the game. The team then has one hour to lodge a written report and pay a bond payment of \$200 to the BBNZ Representative. A Judicial Committee will be assembled to consider the dispute. The Judicial Committee is made up of three members; Technical Commissioner, Tournament Director and the BBNZ Representative. If the Committee rules in favour of the dispute, the bond will be refunded to the team.

Door Charge

Stadium

- Evacuation - If the building needs to be evacuated please leave through the front doors or exits and assemble at the Assembly Point.
- Canteen – The Arena has a café.
- Rubbish - Please be considerate and ensure your team removes any rubbish from your team bench at the end of your game and do not leave rubbish in the changing rooms. Please leave both areas in a tidy state for other teams.
- Traffic to the Stadium - Allow plenty of time to get to your games.

First Aid

- Injury reporting – the Host Association to document all injuries in conjunction with the stadium and BBNZ report form to be filled in and submitted to Emily Cox.
- Blood kits are available at each scorebench.
- A basic first aid kit is available from the tournament office and stadium office.
- Ice can be found in the first aid room located on the entrance corridor to court 3. Ice is only to be used for on court injuries.
- All Te Rauparaha Arena (TRA) staff are first aid certified and will be able to look after any first aid issues, please ask one of the staff or ask at reception to get a staff member. (TRA also have two paramedic certified staff).

Uniforms

- Each team must bring two alternate uniforms to the tournament. Uniform numbers must be: 0 to 99.
- In the event of a uniform clash Team A is to wear their light coloured uniforms and Team B is to wear their dark coloured uniforms, unless both teams come to a mutual agreement.

Team Benches

The team listed first on the score sheet will be Team A and second will be Team B.

Team A **MUST** sit on the left hand bench if you are sitting at the scorebench and Team B **MUST** sit on the right. Please ensure all games start correctly with this procedure. Only the rostered players and team management are allowed to sit on the team bench. All supporters of the team are to sit in the spectators' allocated seating.

Score Sheets

Score sheets will be located on a table outside the tournament office. Please check your team's details are correct prior to each game. BBNZ endeavours to complete the scoresheets with all players' names and playing numbers. Please ensure that all players are listed on the first score sheet. *Once a team's first game commences, only those players listed on the scoresheet for the first game may participate in the remainder of that Tournament as players. [BBNZ Internal Regulations F1.5]*

Score Bench & Statistics

Teams are not required for scorebench or statistic duty. This is covered by the host association.

Game Ball

Molten is the official game ball for the WBC. BBNZ will provide all game basketballs.
