Technical Meeting & Team Roster

There will be no technical meeting for this tournament, if there is any questions you have please do not hesitate to give the BBNZ representative a call at the number above or email.

Please ensure that all your players are registered with the BBNZ office and are eligible to compete in the tournament. After **7pm, Tuesday 6th August** no changes can be made to team rosters, only those players listed before this time and present on the score sheet for the first game may participate in the remainder of that tournament as players.

Please note that by providing your roster to BBNZ, the Association has undertaken player eligibility checks to ensure each player listed in your roster is eligible to participate for your Association.

The Association is responsible for the eligibility of its players at all times and will bear the consequences of any infractions of the Regulations governing Eligibility and Age of Players.

Times

- Warm Up - Minimum of 10 minutes
- Playing Time - 4 x 10 minute stop clock quarters
- Half Time – 5 minutes
- Quarter Time Intervals – 2 minutes
- Extra Periods – 5 minutes
- Extra Period Intervals – 2 minutes

Tournament Information

All info can be picked up from BBNZ at the tournament, including draws and programmes.

Door Charge

Entry is FREE of charge.

Scoresheets

Scoresheets will be available for teams to check prior to their game. Please do not remove the scoresheets from the table.

Scoresheets are located in the middle isle leading to the stadium for teams to check and referees to collect.

Score Bench Duty

Porirua Basketball Association will be providing scorebench personnel for first and last round games. Teams will be scheduled to completed duties in between this.

Uniforms

- Each team must bring two alternate uniforms to the tournament. Teams shall use numbers 0 and 00 and from 1 to 99.
- In the event of a uniform clash Team A is to wear their light coloured uniforms and Team B is to wear their dark coloured uniforms, unless both teams come to a mutual agreement.

Important Details

- Forfeit of Game - \$500 fine.
- Team Benches – Sitting at the scorebench; Team A **MUST** sit to the left and Team B **MUST** sit to the right. Please ensure all games start correctly with this procedure. Only the rostered players and team management are allowed to sit on the team bench. All supporters must sit in the stands.
- Scorebench - If there is a problem with the scorebench, only the coach may approach on a dead ball and then ask the referee to check the enquiry. Other management may approach the bench during the quarter times and at half time break. They **MUST NOT** approach the bench any other time to check the score sheet or query the scorebench.

Behaviour at National Championships

We have on occasion seen a range of poor behaviours demonstrated by spectators, coaches and players over the years. Disappointingly this has occurred largely at the lower age level tournaments. Consequently, there will be strict enforcement of the BBNZ Internal Regulations.

VENUE INFORMATION

Stadium

Te Rauparaha Arena, 17 Parumoana Street, Porirua City
Stadium will be open 1 hour prior to the first round for warm up.

Tournament Control Room

The tournament control room will be in the level one meeting room, any queries to BBNZ or the Tournament Director can be made here.

The floor controller can be found at the baseline of court 1 & 2.

Canteen

The Arena Café will be open from 9am – 4pm normal operating hours; depending on crowd size this may stay open longer.

Changing Rooms

There are 4 changing rooms available at the arena.

Toilets and Showers

Toilets and showers are located in the 4 changing rooms.

Pool:

Teams can use TRA Aquatic Centre, cost is \$2 per person and they have changing rooms and showers. Teams must show evidence that they are playing at the tournament.

Video Taping

Please stay clear of spectator seating and access ways when setting up for any video taping. Please only record from the level one area, no on court filming.

Rubbish

Please be considerate and ensure your team removes any rubbish from the bench at the end of your game. Please do not leave rubbish in the changing rooms and leave in a tidy state for other teams.

Traffic into Porirua

Allow plenty of time to get to your games.

Parking

Free parking is available at Te Rauparaha Arena.

HOUSE – KEEPING

Evacuation

Assembly points are noted on signage by the emergency exit points. Evacuation points will vary depending on where you are in the arena.

Games:

Teams can enter the court via the middle isle, all other isles will be locked off. Only teams and management playing to be on the court please. Other teams can sit upstairs.

Water:

Water containers are located in the middle isle.

First Aid

- Injury reporting – the Host Association to document all injuries in conjunction with the stadium.
- Blood kits are available at the floor controller's desk.
- Ice and a basic first aid kit are available in middle isle leading to court 2, ice will be in the chilly bin. A basic first aid kit will sit on the floor controllers desk just inside the stadium on court 2.
- All Te Rauparaha Arena (TRA) staff are first aid certified and will be able to look after any first aid issues, please ask one of the staff or ask at reception to get a staff member. (TRA also have one paramedic certified staff).
- Physio – to be confirmed – onsite physio
