- Venue address – Ākau Tangi Sports Centre, 72 Kemp Street, Wellington
 - Venue open and closure times – 30mins pre and post
 - Venue entrances & Door charge – No door charge
 - Tournament office location – Near Court 3
 - Placement of noticeboard for tournament info – Near Tournament Office
 - Changing rooms and toilets – 4x Changing Rooms at the back of venue behind Court 5 & 6. Plenty of Toilets around the Venue
 - Sale of goods – Café will be open 8am – 7pm All Days
 - Mouthguards – Wellington Basketball will have for sale – Also plenty of shops which sell mouthguards less than a 5 minute drive.
 - Seating – All spectators must be seated if they are on the ground floor –seating will be provided. Floor controllers will monitor this. The Mezzanine Floor has plenty of standing room to watch the games
 - Video taping – in the stands away from impeding spectators, no on court video taping
 - Clean up your benches – quick transitions, clean before you leave
 - Water Fountains around the venue
 - Evacuation Plan

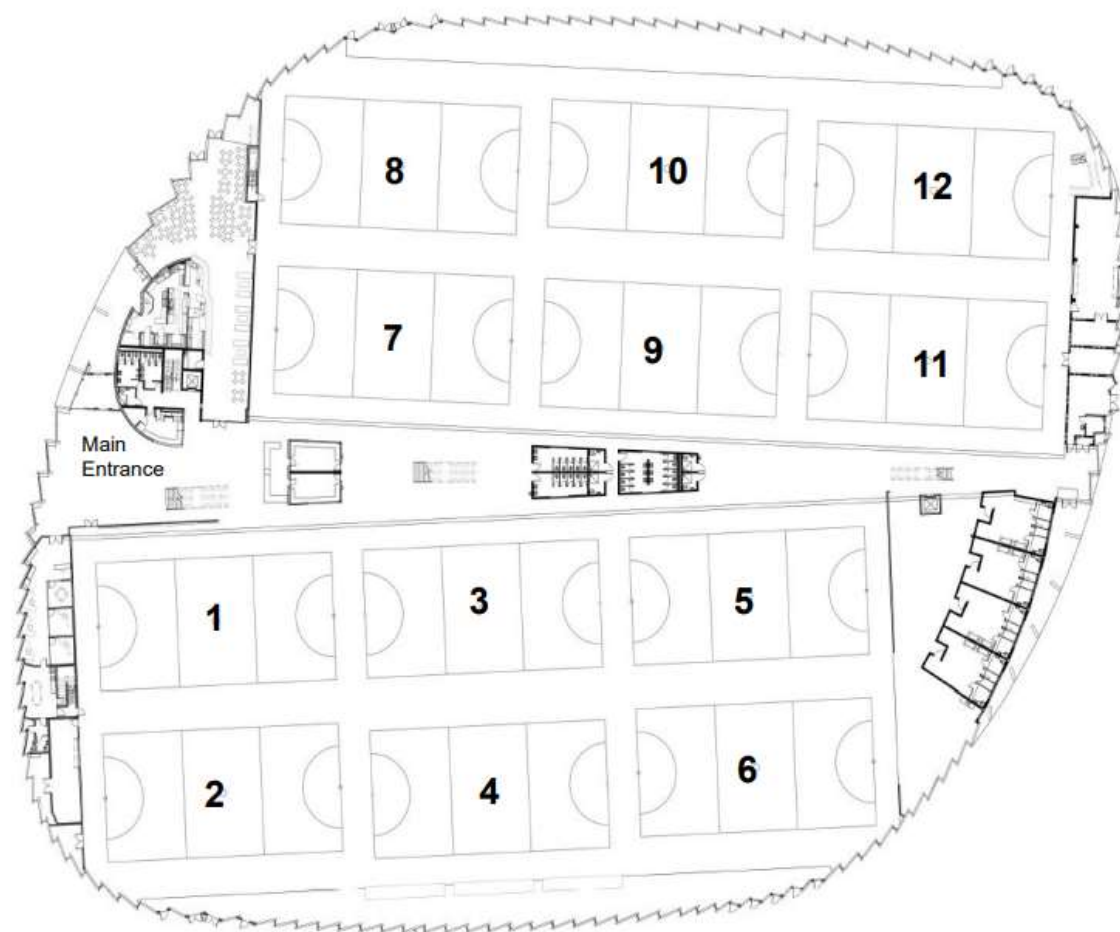

- **The tournament will use Basketball New Zealand Regulations, FIBA Rules, Drug Free Sport New Zealand Policies and BBNZ's Match Fixing Policy.**
- **Times**
 - Warm Up - minimum of 10 minutes
 - Playing Time - 4 x 10 minute stop clock quarters
 - Half Time - 5 minutes
 - Quarter Time Intervals - 2 minutes
 - Extra Periods - 5 minutes
 - Extra Period Intervals - 2 minutes
- **Sitting at the scorebench and In the event of a clash**
 - Team A **MUST** sit to the left - Team A is to wear their light coloured uniforms
 - Team B **MUST** sit to the right - Team B is to wear their dark coloured uniforms
- **No Coaches are to wear BBNZ gear while coaching – Please wear your Association Branded Gear**
- **No Caps allowed to be worn while coaching**

SCORESHEETS & BALLS

- Procedure for game balls – Referees will store and bring to games
- Procedure for scoresheets – All Scoresheets will be done on Glory League (you can check the scoresheet at anytime on the ipads), scoresheets can be available on request. Email jay@nz.basketball
- Scorebench duty roster – teams be aware of your duties post match!

SCOREKEEPER
FIBA SCORING GAME SET UP



1. Ensure that each team is assigned different team colours



2. Tap in all active players



3. Tap in the starting five of each team



Scoring a Game
With SCOREKEEPER LITE



1 Choose Game 2 Team Setup 3 Team Arrows 4 Start Game 5 Add Points 6 Choose Made/ Missed 7 Add Foul 8 Choose Fouler 9 Foul Type 10 Submit Game

1 Choose Game
Select the game then push Start >>>

2 Team Setup
All players must be set to 'Playing'. Tap the 'Not playing' button to set a player to 'Playing'. Tap a number to change a player's number, push Next >>>

3 Team Arrows & Start
Ensure teams are pointing in the correct direction. Push the flip button. When the players take the court, Tap the Start button.

5 Add Points
When a 2pt, 3pt or 1pt Shot is Made, TAP the corresponding button.

6 Choose Made or Missed
Tap the shooter's number.

7 Tap To Add Foul
When the referee blows the whistle to signal a foul, Tap the 'FOUL' button on the bottom right of the iPad.

8 Choose the Fouler
Choose the player who fouled.

9 Choose Foul Type
Tap the big 'FOUL' button. Unless the referee advises otherwise.

10 Submit Game
Once the game is over, tap the 'Submit' button in the top right corner of the interface.

Next Quarter
Once you reach the end of the period, hit the right arrow.

Undo
If you make a mistake, tap the undo button. After you've Undone your Mistake, you can enter the correct event again.

DRAW STRUCTURES

- **Boys: 20 Teams**
- 1 round robin - 4 pools of 5
- 1st and 2nd in each pool qualify for the 1-8 QF-SF-F's
- 3rd and 4th in each pool qualify for the 9-16 QF-SF-F's
- 5th in each pool play a 17-20 Bottom 4 Single Round Robin

- **Girls: 13 Teams**
- 1 round robin – 3 pools of 3 & 1 pool of 4
- 1st from each pool automatically qualify for the 1-8 QF-SF-F's
- 2nd and 3rd from each pool play Preliminary QF's
- Winners qualify for 1-8 QF-SF-F's
- Losers & 4th Pool D play 9-13 Bottom 5 Single Round Robin



CLASSIFICATION / STANDING OF TEAMS



- **CLASSIFICATION OF TEAMS**

- FIBA Rules will be used

- **GAME POINTS**

- 2 points for a win
- 1 point for loss/default (fewer than 2 players on the playing court ready to play.)
- 0 for forfeit of Game & \$500 fine (20-0 scoreline)

- **CLASSIFICATIONS**

- 2 way tie – win – loss record between the teams tied
- If 2 or more teams have the same win-loss record of all games in the group, the game(s) between these 2 or more teams shall decide on the classification. If the 2 or more teams have the same win-loss record of the games between them, further criteria will be applied
 - Higher goal difference – only in the games between them.
 - Further criteria is applied after that.

REFEREE INFORMATION



- **Technical Commissioner**
 - **Cate Baxter**
- **Mouthguards**
 - as per the BBNZ policy these should be worn at all times. We will be working with coaches and management on this and will only at a last resort, sub players out (which will not be occurring at the end of the game)
- **Uniforms**
 - In the event of a clash – team A will need to wear a light strip. However, we ask that both teams work together to ensure we do not have to resort to this rule. A clash is only similar colours not two dark or light shades
 - Undergarments – FIBA has recently changed the rules in regards to undergarments. All compression garments are now allowed, but all players on the team must have the same colour. Only compression garments are permitted, not T-shirts, etc.
- **Behaviour**
 - Coach, Player and Supporter behaviour. As per the BBNZ Code of Conduct, poor behaviour will not be tolerated. A reminder that we all have an onus to present the best possible image of our sport.



Referee info continued

- **Team management roles – The technical rules are**

- The Head Coach is the only team manager who can by rule speak to the referee. In doing so this is to ask a question in a dead ball situation.
- The Assistant Coach may only stand if the Head Coach is sitting and can only speak to their players (not the referees).
- Team management can approach the score table in a dead ball situation if any questions. However, if there is a concern, the Head Coach needs to raise this with the referees (in a polite manner in a dead ball opportunity). Please ensure that you raise concerns asap, as some errors are only correctable in a limited time period.

- **Game Protests**

- Once the iPad is finalised by the referees, then the final noted game score stands. There are no game protests, please be aware of the rules above when you have a score or bench concern.

- **Judicial**

- For any Judicial Matters, please speak to Basketball New Zealand Staff.



Referee info continued

- **Ejections**

- Any player who receives 2 technical fouls or an unsportsmanlike combination thereof will be disqualified from the game and must leave the court area, going to the team's dressing room for the remainder of the game or leaving the building entirely.
- Any player who receives a disqualifying foul must leave the court area, going to the team's dressing room for the remainder of the game or leaving the building entirely. The disqualified player will be chaperoned by the team manager, or an available BBNZ staff member
- A disqualifying foul will require a report to be filed by the referee immediately post-game
- Immediately post-game a panel will be convened to determine the appropriate sanction to be imposed, if any.



COACH INFORMATION



- NO CAPS or BEANIES etc
- NO BBNZ GEAR (while coaching)
- Dress in association branded gear if possible

Coaches Code of Conduct (Book 6, Page 20)

- Coaches shall conduct themselves in a manner that reinforces their place as leaders and role models, and encourage positive communication between themselves and players, referees, administrators and the general public.
- Coaches are to approach referees in a courteous and reasonable manner.
- Head coaches shall not encroach onto the playing floor during the course of a game or move out of the coach's box while the game is in progress.
