Appointment of scrutineers

The Chair put to the meeting that Saileen Raj and Maree Taylor be appointed as the scrutineers

Agreed unopposed by show of hands

Election of two (2) Board Members

- Rob stepped down as chair at this point due to his position on the board being up for election
- Deputy Chair, Amanda Cox took over as chair
- Amanda thanked the Board Appointments Panel (BAP) which included Simon Telfer, Julie Hood and Dave Davies Colley for their support with the recent board member vacancies
- Amanda announced the appointment of Jean Arlove as BBNZ Appointed Board Member
- Amanda invited the three candidates to speak in alphabetical order by surname: Megan Compain, Barry Dent and Rob Gold
- In answer to a question from Harbour Basketball, Board Member Lisa Whyte confirmed that the BBNZ Constitution states the maximum duration in Office an individual may serve on the Board is for 2 successive terms of office for a maximum of 8 consecutive years, so there is no constitutional impediment for Rob standing again

- On completion of their presentations, the candidates left the room while voting took place
- Amanda instructed the members to use the voting cards provided to place their votes.
- All voting cards were collected by the scrutineers
- The candidates up for election rejoined the room

Appointed Board Member

- Amanda invited newly appointed Board Member, Jean Arlove to speak
- Jean Arlove introduced himself to the forum and shared a little bit about himself
- With the voting completed, Rob resumed as Chair of the meeting

Board Internship

- Board Member Megan Compain noted that in May 2023 the Board invited Ariana Reweti to become BBNZ's first Intern Director for a 12-month term
- Megan acknowledged the skills that Ariana was able to contribute to the Board and thanked her for her involvement and hard work especially in the Te Ao Māori space
- Due to the success of the internship, BBNZ is looking for the next Future Director through the Institute of Directors with a commencement date of 1 June 2024

Report from the Chair

- Rob acknowledged the high representation that New Zealand has within FIBA
- Rob shared BBNZ's 2024 – 2028 Strategic Intent highlighting the four pillars that drive everything BBNZ does, Participation Impact, Performance, Fan Experience and Diversity
- Rob thanked Board Member, Anna Gestro for her work in this space
- BBNZ has been on a journey to achieve its Governance Mark approval which is Sport New Zealand's Accreditation for good governance. Lisa has driven this area
- Rob noted that the Board and BBNZ are continuing its Te Ao Māori journey. The Board are focused on genuine engagement and developing relationships that benefit all
- Rob acknowledged the great work that BBNZ's CE, Dillon Boucher is doing, "we are in great shape and Dillon is a key part of that". Rob also acknowledged and thanked the BBNZ staff

Chief Executive presentation

- Rob invited Dillon to address the meeting
- Dillon welcomed everyone with a mihi
- Dillon thanked the meeting, the wider basketball community and BBNZ staff for their efforts to provide opportunities within basketball across Aotearoa
- Dillon was proud to present highlights from 2023

Results of the election of two (2) Board Members

- Amanda confirmed the votes had been counted by the scrutineers
- Amanda confirmed that Rob Gold and Megan Compain were re-elected as Board Members of the Basketball New Zealand Board of Directors for a term of four (4) years

- Amanda thanked Barry Dent for standing for election

Finance Report

- Basketball New Zealand's Chief Operating Officer, Belinda Edwards was invited to present the Financial Report and provide a summary of the financials for 2023
- The consolidated annual financial result for BBNZ was \$1,243,469. This includes a payout of \$1,195,000 from Entain. The Board approved to reimburse Associations 50% of their 2023 BBNZ membership fee from this payout
- The remaining balance is in a term deposit as a capital investment fund. BBNZ is currently working on a process to receive applications from Associations or other organisations to look at joint ventures in capital investment. Once the details are available they will be shared with Associations
- Once the Entain payout is removed, BBNZ ends the 2023 financial year with a group surplus of \$48,859.00
- BBNZ ends the financial year with a net loss of \$21,294. Legal and Consulting fees were higher than budgeted
- NBLL saw a profit in 2023 of \$70,126 which is related to sponsorship revenue including Sky Investment and local council funding that contributed towards the finals event
- BBNZ Events Ltd ended the year with a surplus of \$27
- BBNZ finishes the year with \$5.1 million dollars in assets, of this \$3.3 million dollars is in cash.
- Accumulated Reserves is \$2.8 million dollars which exceeds BBNZ's current reserves policy which currently stands at 6 months' worth of operating costs
- Recommendations from the auditors have been considered for 2024 resulting in more streamlined approach to financial management and more extensive reporting to the Finance, Audit and Risk Committee
- John Hunt asked what is BBNZ's optimum FTE. Belinda confirmed BBNZ currently has 39 budgeted FTE and we feel we are set up with adequate FTE to move us into the next phase of the new Basketball Structure
- Anthony Corban asked what the increase was with regard to the National Basketball Spend, Belinda confirmed that this was in relation to Sky Sports investment in the NBL, Taihi and Rapid Leagues.
- Belinda was recognised by the Board for her time as a director and Deputy Chair on the BBNZ Board. The Board are excited to see the impact Belinda will make in the COO role.

FIBA Oceania

- David Reid, President of FIBA Oceania and First Vice President of FIBA addressed the meeting
- David congratulated Rob and Megan on their elections, and thanked Barry for standing for election
- David shared a little about himself and noted he is Basketball New Zealand's representative within FIBA

Election of Patron

- Judge John Macdonald was re-elected as Patron at the 2023 AGM, for a term of 5 years

Life member election

- No life member nominations received

2025 Membership levies

- Lisa provided a summary of the proposed individual membership fee structure as noted in the meeting papers
- The purpose of the proposal is to create a process that produces good data which can then be used to maximise propositions to commercial partners and other funding streams
- John Hunt, Harbour Basketball asked when would the money be disbursed back to associations and what is the sponsorship value that members would receive as being a member of Basketball New Zealand? Dillon first highlighted the great work Harbour Basketball is doing in this space as all players are required to register prior to playing. Dillon explained that the details need to be worked through by a working group which will be made up by people within this room
- Clive Beaumont, Canterbury Basketball questioned why the proposal is being voted on now when the detail isn't available. Clive also asked what other avenues have been looked at to collect data such as Coach Mate. Dillon confirmed other platforms have been explored. The idea is to find one consistent platform that can collect all data including players, coaches, officials etc. A tool that Associations can input staff contact details so it is one source of truth.
- Players will only be charged once a year regardless of the number of teams they play for
- Members will receive a lifetime membership identification number
- Members can coach for free but as soon as they tick player, they will be charged the membership fee

- Brian Carr, Counties Manukau expressed concerns that the changes may be too much too soon when taking into consideration that Associations will be moving to a two-tiered system
- Applications for tiered status for Associations will be available shortly. At this stage thresholds will be based off the 2023 membership data, it will be adjusted accordingly each year
- A tiered fee structure has been considered and is something the working group could look at
- Lisa reiterated that there is a constitutional requirement to agree the value of membership fees for the following year. Lisa put the motion to vote

Motion: Support in principle the transition to an individual membership fee of \$20 per member from 2025 alongside the implementation of service level agreements which identify the due dates for payment and association rebates

General Business

- Brian Carr, suggested a review of the loan and transfer process/policy when completing the Service Level Agreements (SLA's). Dillon confirmed that is reviewed annually, it was discussed at the Community Advisory Group on Friday 3rd May and further information will be shared shortly
- Tom Te Puni, asked what shared services does Basketball New Zealand have available or are looking into that associations could utilize. Dillon noted that BBNZ's Commercial Manager, Dave Everitt is working hard to look at telco, electricity, Xero, vehicles etc associations are certainly at the front of mind when doing commercial deals.
- Burton Shipley, on behalf of FIBA, requested that BBNZ move to a 3 term election ceiling not the current two. The reason being, before anyone can be nominated for a role in FIBA they need to have served two terms on the local board

Close Meeting

- Rob Gold invited board member, Glen Denham to share a few closing words
- Glen Denham acknowledged and thanked everyone for attending and how good it was to see so many people from the basketball community
- Glen thanked the two New Zealand Sign Language interpreters
- Glen remembered ex Tall Black and Detective Constable Duncan Taylor who was tragically killed in 2002
- Glen shared past personal experiences with members, highlighting the impact that basketball has had on his life
- Glen reiterated the importance of working together as one to achieve greatness

Welcome, Karakia

- BBNZ's Board Chair, Rob Gold opened the meeting with a karakia and welcomed all participants joining online
- The forum was reminded that the SGM was called following the Membership Levy motion presented at the 2024 AGM, which did not pass. It was agreed that a working group would further develop the proposal to present it again at an SGM
- Rob Acknowledged the made over the four months since the AGM and expressed gratitude to everyone involved, in particular Barry Dent who lead the working group
- In response to feedback and considering the online format of the meeting, the board opted for a more independent and auditable voting process
- Rob confirmed that voting for the SGM would be conducted through BigPulse, an online voting platform
- A short explanation was provided on how the voting would occur. Rob noted that the scrutineers cannot see which option members voted for, they can only see if a vote has been cast. Voting would be open from 6:30pm to 7pm

The Chair put to the meeting that Shay-Marie Peneha, employee of Basketball New Zealand and an independent scrutineer, Charlotte Cameron, Solicitor for Gibson Sheat be appointed as the scrutineers

Agreed unopposed by the meeting

Roll call

- Basketball New Zealand's Chief Operating Officer, Belinda Edwards read the roll call
- As Belinda worked through the roll call, she confirmed the total number of votes including proxies for each voting member

Basketball Development Levy Proposal

Barry Dent, Chair of the working group summarised the working groups process

Motion

- Rob confirmed that voting was open at 6pm
- Members voted online via BigPulse for one of the below options

voting option A or B

Option A: 2025 Basketball Development Levy Fees for competition players* are set at \$5 for 14 year olds and under, \$10 for 15 to 19 year olds and \$15 for 20 year olds and over.

*Competition Player is anyone actively playing basketball in 3x3, 5v5 or other endorsed iterations of basketball leagues and competitions. This applies to all basketball competitions and leagues governed by BBNZ and its affiliated associations).

Option B: The affiliation fee model will remain for 2025. Affiliation fees are set at 2024 rates plus 4.7% which is the CPI rate for 2023

Results

- The scrutineers left the meeting/room to review the results via BigPulse
- Board member Amanda Cox confirmed that Option A received 60.76% of the total votes and therefore has passed
