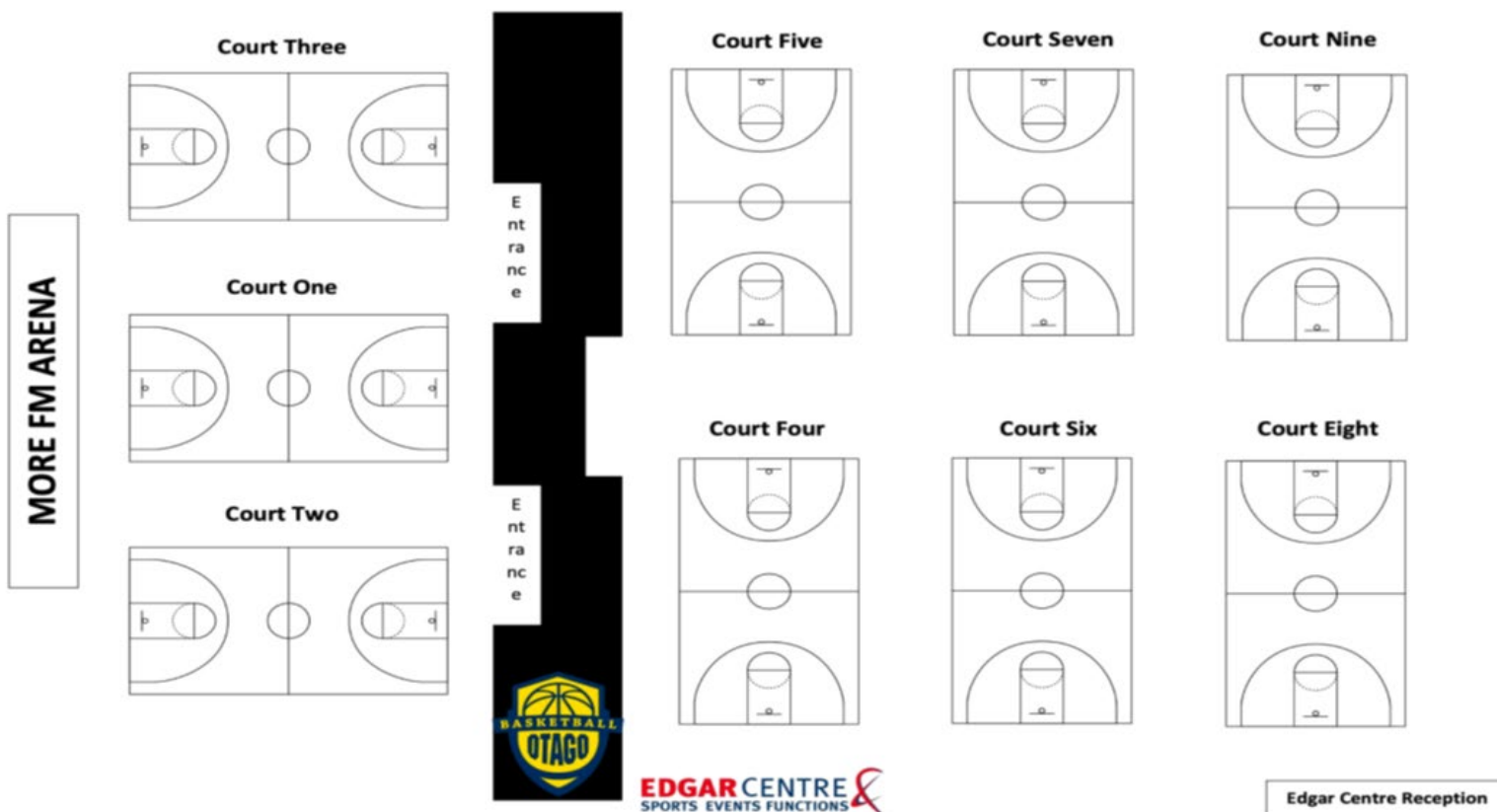


- **Venue** – Edgar Centre, 116 Portsmouth Drive, Dunedin
- **Venue Open and Closure** – 30 minutes, pre and post
- **Venue Entrances & Door Charges** – Entrance via main door of Edgar Centre, no door charge
- **Parking** – Staff carparks are marked and signed. Please do not park there. There are plenty of carparks available and around the back of the stadium.
- **Tournament Office / Control Desk** – Basketball Otago Office
- **Noticeboard/Tournament Info** – Near Tournament Office
- **Changing Rooms and toilets** – Toilets in between the entrances of arena and stadium and after you enter the stadium from main entrance. Changing rooms are in the stadium.
- **Edgar Centre Café** – Saturday – Sunday, 9:00am till 5:00pm. Monday – Tuesday – 9:00am till 3:00pm (or later if busy)

The tournament will use Basketball New Zealand Regulations, FIBA Rules, Drug Free Sport New Zealand Policies and BBNZ's Match Fixing Policy.

TIMES –

Warm Up – Minimum of 10 minutes

Playing Time – 4 x 10-minute stop clock quarters

Half Time – 5-minutes

Quarter Time Intervals – 2-minutes

Extra Periods – 5-minutes

Extra Period Intervals – 2-minutes

Sitting at the scorebench and in the event of a clash –

Team A **MUST** sit to the left – Team A is to wear their light coloured uniforms

Team B **MUST** sit to the right – Team B is to wear their dark coloured uniforms

Team Benches

ONLY team members on the benches – 12 players, 4 management staff

COMPETITION INFO BALLS AND GLORY LEAGUE



- **BALLS & SCORESHEETS –**

- Referees will store and bring to games. Please ensure that if you find a Basketball Otago labelled ball, that this gets returned.
- All scoresheets will be done on Glory League (scoresheet will be available to be checked during quarter time on the iPads). Scoresheets can be available on request. Email tori@nz.basketball
- iPads for Glory League will be on the courts so please make sure that you get these filled out once the game before has concluded.

- **Uniforms, team lists, and numbers**

- Please make sure that you CHECK your team list and numbers when filling out the iPad as sometimes these can change.
- Online database can incorrectly fill team lists from time to time.
- Players who are not marked as “active” before the game, will not be allowed to take the court during that game.
- No changes can be made to your roster after this meeting with the exception of playing numbers as only the players listed at the beginning of the tech meeting can participate in the tournament.

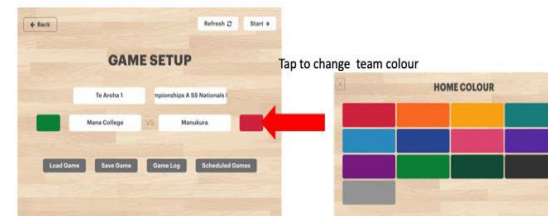


- **Glory League and Bench –**

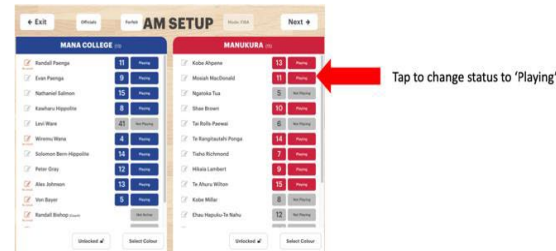
SCOREKEEPER

COMPETITION INFORMATION DRAW



- **Draw and Duty –**
- Please have a look at the draw carefully on when your team has duty. Updates will be made on draw throughout the tournament when we get to playoffs.

CLASSIFICATION/STANDING OF TEAMS



- **Classification of teams –**
- FIBA Rules will be used
- **Game Points –**
- 2 points for a win
- 1 point for loss/default (fewer than 2 players on the playing court ready to play)
- 0 for forfeit of game & \$500 fine (20-0 score)
- **Classification –**
- 2-way tie – win – loss record between the teams tied
- If 2 or more teams have the same win-loss record of all games in the group, the game(s) between these 2 or more teams shall decide on the classification. If the 2 or more teams have the same win-loss record of the games between them, further criteria will be applied
- Higher goal difference – only in the games between the teams in the tie
- Further criteria is applied after that

LIVE STREAMING



- Basketball New Zealand align with the principles and guidelines of Sports NZ's 'Keep up with the play' and 'Balance is Better' initiatives, positive behaviour and support, and will make every effort to align our broadcast messaging to those values.
- Be aware of what you, your team and spectators are posting – please keep it positive
- No public or private streaming as we do not have control of the space and place this goes too, amongst other reasons.

COACH INFORMATION



- No coaches are to wear BBNZ gear while coaching – please wear your school branded gear
- No caps or beanies allowed to be worn while coaching
- Coaches Code of Conduct (Book 6, Page 20)
- Coaches shall conduct themselves in a manner that reinforces their place as leaders and role models, and encourage positive communication between themselves and players, referees, administrators and the general public.
- Coaches are to approach referees in a courteous and reasonable manner.
- Head coaches shall not encroach onto the playing floor during the course of a game or move out of the coach's box while the game is in progress.

REFEREE INFORMATION



- **Technical Commissioner –**

- John Bartlett

- **Mouthguards –**

- As per the BBNZ policy these should be worn at all times. We will be working with coaches and management on this and will only at a last resort, sub players out (which will not be occurring at the end of the game)

- **Uniforms –**

- In the event of a clash – team A will need to wear their light strip. However, we ask that both teams work together to ensure we do not have to resort to this rule. A clash is only similar colours not two dark or light shades.

- Undergarments – FIBA has recently changed the rules in regards to undergarments. All compression garments are now allowed, but all players on the team must have the same colour. Only compression garments are permitted, same colour as for everyone in the team and NO t-shirts etc.

- **Behaviour –**

- Coach, Player and Supporter behaviour. As per the BBNZ Code of Conduct, poor behaviour will not be tolerated. A reminder that we all have an onus to present the best possible image of our sport.

REFEREE INFORMATION



- **Team Management Roles –**

- The Head Coach is the only team manager who can by rule speak to the referee. In doing so, this is to ask a question in a dead ball situation.
- The Assistant Coach may only stand if the Head Coach is sitting and can only speak to their players (not the referees)
- Manager can only approach the score table during quarter time and half time. If they have any concerns, they need to go to the coach to bring it up with the score table and referees if needed.
- Head and Assistant Coach can approach the score table in a dead ball situation if any questions. However, if there is a concern, the Head Coach needs to raise this with the referees (in a polite manner in a dead ball opportunity). Please ensure that you raise concerns asap, as some errors are only correctable in a limited time period.

- **Code of Conduct –**

- All players, spectators, and coaches are to obey by the Basketball New Zealand Code of Conduct. Please make sure that you read through this.

- **No Game Protest**

- Once the iPad is finalized by the referees, then the final noted game score stands. There are no game protests, please be aware of the rules above when you have a score or bench concern.

- **Judicial / Complaints**

- Any complaints can be made directly to the Technical Commissioner.

REFEREE INFORMATION



- **Ejections –**
- Any player who receives two technical fouls or an unsportsmanlike combination thereof will be disqualified from the game and must leave the court area, going to the team's dressing room for the remainder of the game or leaving the building entirely.
- Any player who receives a disqualifying foul must leave the court area, going to the team's dressing room for the remainder of the game or leaving the building entirely. The disqualified player will be chaperoned by the team manager or Technical Commissioner/Tournament Director.
- A disqualifying foul will require a report to be filed by the referee immediately post-game.

REFEREE INFORMATION



- **Referee Responsibility –**
- Referees need to bring their own whistle and referee shirt if they have one
- All teams are to provide a referee for their team who needs to be available for the duration of the WHOLE tournament.
- If you haven't passed on your referees name to myself or Basketball New Zealand, please do so.
- If there are any clashes or I need to be aware of things, please let me know asap.
